

Polish government has provided Australia with 1 million doses of Pfizer vaccine,

reselling on a non profit basis its surplus of COVID-19 vaccines. Poland has recently offered to share vaccines mainly with low and middle-income countries, including its Eastern neighbours, Balkan countries etc.

The decision to also add Australia to the list was taken against the backdrop of the current outbreak of Delta variant in the country, following the talks between both countries' officials, including the Prime Ministers and Foreign Ministers.

After swift completion of all necessary procedures, the delivery will land in Australia shortly. Poland commends Australian authorities for excellent collaboration in a first joint operation of this kind and hopes that the provision will support Australia's efforts to ramp up its vaccine rollout in this critical moment.
